# Recap: Mondale Award and Scholarship **Gala** 2020

As we reach ever closer to the end of this unfathomable year, we celebrated one of JASM's biggest annual events. On the evening of November 13th, JASM held its 23<sup>rd</sup> annual Mondale Award and Scholarship Gala. Of course, due to the current pandemic, the gala was not held at the usual Oak Ridge Country Club in Hopkins but was instead live-streamed.

The night began with introductory remarks by Clint Connor, Dorsey & Whitney partner and JASM board member. He emphasized the importance of creating cross-cultural connections, then introduced the second speaker, Ron Leonhardt. Ron is the new Honorary Consul of Japan in Minnesota. Consul-General of Japan in Chicago Kenichi Okada was next to give his greetings.

Our keynote speaker for this gala was museum specialist Noriko Sanefuji of Smithsonian's National Museum of American History. Ms. Sanefuji strongly expressed the desire to be with us in Minnesota, preferring to use Doraemon's "anywhere door" to be here if it were possible. Her keynote address highlighted Asian-American communities, and she proclaimed that American history belongs to everyone. She noted that

many Asian-American communities across the U.S. have held webinars, history town halls, or online panels in 2020 – not to elicit fear or grief, but to help us heal and move forward connecting the past to the present. Ms. Sanefuji also presented a video about Japanese-American incarceration during World War II and an exhibition that featured some of the art and artifacts from the internment camps.

# **Upcoming: Sake Tasting and Ceramic Talk:** Thinking Outside the Bottle



Please join our event, Sake Tasting and Ceramic Talk: Thinking outside the Bottle, Thursday, December 3 at 6 pm, which will be our second sake tasting experience. This time the event features sake expert Chris Griese from Sake Story, and art historian Dr. Andreas Marks, the Head of the Japanese and Korean Art Department at Mia (Minneapolis Institute of Art).

Sake Story

Chris Griese will discuss three sake selected for this event. Dr. Marks will showcase ceramic sake cups and will describe how they enhance the tasting experience. You can take part in the sake tasting if you purchase the Minneapolis Institute of Art selected sake from Surdyk's, one of our

corporate members. You'll be able to taste the flavors and learn all about the sake selections from the comfort of your home. Please note: this event is for guests 21 years of age or older.

**Dr. Andreas Marks** shares these pre-tasting comments: "A beautiful, well-designed cup enhances the experience and pleasure of drinking. Sake is traditionally sipped from guinomi, small cups that demand frequent refilling. Masterpieces in miniature, these little cups condense the skill, technique, and personal style of a potter. Today, artists are free to innovate and push the limits of form, while others uphold tradition." Thursday's presentation will introduce guinomi made of stoneware or porcelain by nine living artists, including Fukami Sueharu, internationally renowned for his abstract sculptures, as well as Fukumoto Fuku, one of the leading women ceramicists today.

On August 1st, 2020, the Government of Japan appointed Mr. Ron Leonhardt, a former Japan America Society of Minnesota Board Member, as the new Honorary Consul General of Japan in Minneapolis.

As a JASM board member Mr. Leonhardt served as: a judge of the annual J-Quiz, the competition for high school students in their knowledge of Japanese language and culture; was on the committee for the Annual

Mondale Award and Scholarship Gala; and hosted artists from Japan to introduce them to Minneapolis and its culture. Furthermore, he supported the JASM office as our HR person. He was instrumental in identifying and assigning the critical responsibilities of each JASM team member.

Mr. Leonhardt was born to a German Japanese father and Portuguese mother in Kobe, Japan in 1966. He and his older sister are considered second generation foreigners, born and raised in Japan. After graduating from the American High School, he attended Georgetown University. He worked for Fuji Bank in New York for three years as a young professional. Then he completed a graduate degree in international business at Columbia University. He is the Director of HR for Zinpro Corporation and served on the JASM Board of Directors for a total of 18 years.

From Minnesota, Mr. Richard E. Stahl has been recognized for his outstanding contribution to the Japan-US relationship:

Order of the Rising Sun, Gold Rays with Rosette for Mr. Richard E. Stahl, Former Honorary Consul of Japan in Minneapolis

As the Honorary Consul of Japan in Minnesota for 5 years, Mr. Stahl made invaluable contributions to the Japan-Minnesota relationship by facilitating exchange through Japanese culture, economy, and a variety of other fields. He also actively collaborated with the Japan America Society of Minnesota and their activities as their former president. In addition, he worked hard in promoting the sister city relationships between Minneapolis and Ibaraki city, as well as St. Paul and Nagasaki city. Mr. Stahl also passionately supported Japanese residents living in Minnesota.

Mr. Stahl also provided great support of the Japan-United States relationship in Chicago. Mr. Stahl served in senior leadership positions with the Japan America Society of Chicago from 1983 to 2000. He was Executive Vice President of the Society for most of the 1990's. In addition, he was Executive Vice President of The Long-Term Credit Bank of Japan for 12 years. As such, he was the most senior American working with a Japan Bank in Chicago.

The remarkable achievements of the recipient represent the diversity and depth of the relations between Japan and the United States.



# Tom Haeg's Book Review



Every Color of Light: A Book about the Sky; Hiroshi Osada, Enchanted Lion, 2020; 38 pages.

This holiday season if you scamper around the mall (or surf the internet) searching for the perfect gift for a child, you will be wise to keep your choices simple, useful, and entertaining. No batteries, no assembly, 'one size fits all.' Here is a suggestion: *Every Color of Light*.

This 38-page Japanese children's book, translated by David Boyd with artwork by Ryoji Arai, is a delightful kaleidoscope of imagery from the course of a day, sure to ignite any child's (or adult's) imagination. Example: "Look, it is raining/ Pitter-patter, pitter-patter/The rain gets louder. /Wetter and wetter, the blues darken. /So do the greens." The text and colorful illustrations will remind you of a nostalgic hike through a bucolic Japanese forest. Osada's subliminal aim is to jump-start a child reader to experience a heightened sense of awareness of nature. And the book delivers. Sun streaming through porous clouds; water ponds glimmering with light; palettes awash with color. Our author wants the child to engage all senses: tactile, seeing, smelling, or hearing, to appreciate everything nature offers without holding back.

The genius of children's literature is to sound a profound adult theme while entertaining the child. There is a monochromatic Goethe quote; it goes something like this: "There is strong shadow where there is bright light." In other words, while experiencing nature things may not exactly appear as they are; you must dream beyond the nearness. In more words, don't let the obvious cause gloom, look beyond for the good. The lesson: it is okay to eschew the shadow and consider the light.

*Every Color* is the pith of children's literature: saying what is simple, useful and entertaining.
