### Recap: 2021 Virtual Mondale Award and Scholarship Gala: Remembering Ambassador Mondale



As the end of another tumultuous year approaches, we look back to one of JASM's largest annual events. On the evening of Friday, November 5th, JASM held the 24<sup>th</sup> annual Mondale Scholarship and Award Gala. The event was streamed live online, free for all to view.

As many of us are already aware, we sadly lost Ambassador Mondale earlier this year. For decades he was a great inspiration, and as such this year's gala was wholeheartedly dedicated to him. Rather than inviting a single keynote speaker, several speakers were invited to share their stories of how Ambassador Mondale impacted their lives, as a tribute to him. The wonderful flower arrangement on display during the event was made by the Sogetsu Study Group, led by Yoshie Babcock.

JASM Board Member and host Joe Montgomery led off the gala with a brief rundown of the night's programming. He handed off the reins to Honorary Consul-General Ron Leonhardt, who introduced brand-new Consul-General of



Japan in Chicago Hiroshi Tajima and his impressive background in international relations. Consul-General Tajima provided a welcome video where he noted he had heard Ambassador Mondale embodied the best of the Midwest. The Consul-General very much looks forward to strengthening relationships in his honor.



Next, Joe emceed the heart of the event: the various heartfelt tributes to the late Ambassador Mondale expressing the tremendous impact he has had upon each speaker. First up was Minnesota U.S. Senator Amy Klobuchar, who described Ambassador Mondale as

"scrupulously honest." She shared that her first job in Washington had been an internship at Ambassador Mondale's office and how grateful she is towards him as a mentor. She closed with a look to the future, with an emphasis on the importance of the Mondale Scholarship and handing off the torch to the next generation.



Immediately following Senator Klobuchar was the current Ambassador of Japan to the U.S. Koji Tomita. Ambassador Tomita recalled frequently working with Ambassador Mondale while in Japan and the kindness he radiated even well after his retirement. Prior

to giving his condolences, he made sure to emphasize honoring Ambassador Mondale by following in his footsteps and ensuring our strong ties well into the future.



The next speaker was Kent Calder, the Interim Dean of the John Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies. Mr. Calder served as special advisor to Ambassador Mondale when he was ambassador in Japan and has many fond memories of him. He highlighted Ambassador Mondale's

great impact on U.S.-Japan relations, his understanding of grassroots diplomacy, and, above all else, his respect for others at the heart of his persona. Mr. Calder said he is more than honored to have known Ambassador Mondale.

The gala also held the delight of a story from a World War II veteran's daughter, Mary Tomes. Ambassador Mondale motivated her father, Arthur Tomes, to return to Japan many decades after the war. With Ambassador Mondale's encouragement, Mr. Tomes gained the confidence to return to Japan and give a beautiful speech on making peace and reconciliation. Gala viewers also heard stories of Ambassador Mondale from a past executive director of JASM, Ben van Lierop; the current executive director of JASM, Rio Saito; and a former associate of the Ambassador at Dorsey & Whitney, Chris Bercaw. From his strong work ethic to being the hero of many, every speaker shared warm, fond memories of Ambassador Mondale. We are all inspired to build lasting relationships in his footsteps.



Once the tributes were complete, it was time to present the Mondale Award. Presenting the award this year was Marc Blehert, Chairman of the Mondale Award Selection Committee. He and everyone at JASM were honored to present this year's

Mondale Award for Japan-Minnesota Partnership to Sarah Walbert for her unwavering support for bridging Japan-Minnesota relations. Sarah has been an active JASM volunteer for over 40 years and secured many strong international business ties throughout decades of work. In her acceptance speech, Sarah admitted that "We can't all be a Walter Mondale, but you keep nurturing the seeds until one day you realize they've taken on a life of their own and grown into something meaningful." Some of those seeds planted grew into what we know as the Mondale Scholarship Program, and the prominence of JASM in Japan-Minnesota relations continuing to be nurtured to this very day. We thank Sarah for her resilience and inspiration for helping to create this amazing community.





# Tom Haeg's Book Review

*The Business Reinvention of Japan: How to Make Sense of the New Japan and Why It Matters*; Ulrike Schaede, Stanford Business Books, 2020.



Japan, Inc. lost over 7 trillion dollars in market value in the 1990s. Overnight it was challenged by a formidable Asian rival, some 1.4 billion Chinese, who threatened its dominance as the world's leading export-driven economy. Its demographics were out of whack. Its public debt was an embarrassment. Its traditional corporate culture was stale. Time for a change.

Schaede opines that the catalyst for change was a healthy reexamination of its place on the global supply chain. As a result, it decided to distance itself from the cheap economies dependent on consumer products with low margins. Japanese businesses began to search for enterprises in the supply chain that stressed business-to-business items with advanced technological advantages without sacrificing *kaizen*. Said in another way: while Japan may not be the assembler of the iPhone, it still is a significant contributor to its components and technology. Schaede refers to this approach as the aggregate *niche strategy* to non-consumer products to catapult Japan's growing global manufacturing network.

While reading this book, I came across a *Wall Street Journal* article, "The Toshiba Split: A Farewell to Poor Japanese Management". I found it curious that its author did not allude to Ms. Schaede's reinvention theories. Instead, it cited deep-rooted inefficiencies, productivity failures, and corporate governance lapses. So, while the two approaches may differ (remember, the authors are economists), they do agree on the outcome: "This is itself a very new condition for Japan, Inc., and one that holds out some hope for revival, gradually or suddenly, in Japan's lagging economy."
