This year, we were fortunate to hear from State Representative Samantha Sencer-Mura as our keynote speaker, who spoke about her own story and the important work of fostering crosscultural understanding and relationships. Rep. Samantha Sencer-Mura is the first Japanese American to serve as a legislator in Minnesota,

representing District 63-A in Minneapolis. Her election and service represents an important milestone in the history of Minnesota's state government and in the diversification of its elected officials. Following her speech, President Luck returned to the podium to present the Mondale Award to this year's recipient, Mr. Dick Stahl. Dick has been an advocate for promoting U.S. relations with Japan and other nations for decades through volunteer and professional work, and was even awarded the Order of the Rising Sun and Gold Rays with Rosette by Consul-General of Japan in Chicago, Kenichi Okada, in 2021.

### **Recap: JASM Fundraiser Chirimen** and more 2.0





## **Tom Haeg's Book Review**

Judgment at Tokyo; Gary J. Bass, Knopf Press, 2023; 912 pages.



After more than 75 years, Gary Bass, esteemed political science professor at Princeton University, shakes off the dust of trial transcripts, misplaced documents and dated journal entries to cast new light on the so-called and obliquely misunderstood International Military Tribunal of the Far East, aka a Nuremburg-style trial to adjudicate the Japanese Imperial military after World War II. It is a story tracing legal proceedings lasting over two years resulting in seven death sentences, 16 life imprisonments, two lesser

sentences and one dismissal for unfitness to stand trial. Acquittals: none.

Judgment claims the Tribunal was lax in due process and ignorant in legal definitions to hastily execute the 1945 Potsdam Declaration as its legal authority and raison d'etre. Bass is not kind to the Chief Justice, Australia's William Webb, and neither were the other justices. They referred to Webb as "the dictator" and regarded him as "... argumentative and injudicious ... " Bass proceeds to criticize all 11 jurists, representing 11 countries, as disparate and leaning to advocate for vengeance from purely national interests instead of justice. There were distracting dissents by three jurists who took issue with the proceedings. One in particular caught my attention. It was written by the Indian jurist Radhabin Pal in a loquacious 1,230 page dissent essentially apologizing for Japanese Imperialism under the pretext of colonial revisionism. The dissent has been inherited by post-War Japanese nationalists to excuse criminal activity during the war. And this is interesting: I learned there actually is a monument dedicated to the memory of Pal in the Yasukuni Shrine in Tokyo. Go figure.

In fairness, Mr. Bass cites the Tokyo carpet bombing and the civilians who died in Hiroshima and Nagasaki as politically motivated and hypocritical omissions of judgment by the Tribunal diminishing its legal and moral authority. And let us not forget the general amnesty extended to Emperor Hirohito and the over-reaching effect of the Supreme Commander, Douglas MacArthur. Nonetheless, for purposes of closure, he cites the Mainichi Shinbun when it wrote "the executions of Japan's war leaders must become a symbol of the rejection of war for the entire world."

Judgment is thorough and definitive, exuding comprehensive academic research and support. It can be read on several academic levels: trial review, history and social commentary. After another 75 years it will endure for its excellent scholarship.
